LEGENDARY SERVICE KEEPS CUSTOMERS COMING BACK TO LES SCHWAB TIRE CENTER

Supermarket selection, world-class customer service, convenient credit, written warranty

The birth of the Les Schwab Tire Company took place in January of 1952 when Les Schwab purchased a small OK Rubber Welders tire store in Prineville, Oregon. With a \$3,500 investment and a strong desire to own his own business, Les increased the sales of this store from \$32,000 to \$150,000 in the first year. Les had a powerful determination to provide opportunity for people who could not afford to go into business for themselves

On January 1, 1954 Les started the first profit share program with his Redmond, Oregon store manager and this was just the start of things to come. In 1955, Les opened his third OK Rubber Welders tire store in Bend and, within a year, changed the name to Les Schwab Tire Center.

This was an important time for the Les Schwab Tire Company. As the company continued to grow, Les developed what is known as the supermarket tire store concept. He had a goal to have his warehouse in his showroom, so customers could walk through the racks of tires and pick out the ones they wanted for their vehicles. Along with this concept, Les decided to stock more than one brand of tire in each size to give his customers a choice. This stocking policy was not popular with the maior rubber companies at the time, but was an important part of Les' supermarket tire store concept.

In 1966, the Les Schwab Tire

Company became totally independent following Les' decision to take down all OK Rubber Welders signs and replace them with the Les Schwab sign. This was a big year, as Les formed the Les Schwab Retirement Trust for his employees and purchased six stores and a retread shop in Idaho, bringing the total company store count to 18.

The company continued to grow, and by 1972 had a total of 35 stores. Retreading continued to play a big part with the company and this is the year Les Schwab's More-Mile retreading process was developed for truck tire customers. More-Mile retreading continues to play an important role in Les Schwab's truck retread business.

Today the Les Schwab Tire Company has more than 500 locations with plans to open roughly 10 to 15 new stores a year. As one of the largest independent tire companies in the United States, Les Schwab continues to expand in Colorado, Central California and California's Inland Empire.

In addition to operating one of the largest tire retreading plants in the country, Les Schwab has a distribution center with more than two million square feet under one roof in Prineville, Oregon. The company is proud to stock more than five million tires at all times, company-wide, for its customers.

The success of the Les Schwab Tire Company has been made possible by its wonderful customers, who are the most important people in the company's business. Nothing happens in the company until a customer decides to buy a tire, wheel, alignment or any of the other services offered. Les Schwab is proud to feature neat, clean stores, supermarket selection, world-class customer service, convenient credit and a written warranty for which customers don't pay extra. "If we can't guarantee it, we won't sell it" is a commitment the company makes to its customers, and it's not taken lightly!

Dedication in Action

Commissioner has a proven track record



"It's important that people feel they can walk in and have a conversation with their elected officials," Johnston says. "That's how trust is built—by showing up and listening." Since taking office in January 2023, Commissioner Johnston has been recognized for his work ethic and common-sense leadership. He has earned a reputation for being both approachable and transparent —qualities that residents across Yamhill County say they appreciate.

As Chair of the Board, Johnston expanded the office's responsibilities by serving as a liaison to cities across the county and launching "Chat with the Chair," a monthly gathering where residents can ask questions, share concerns, and hear directly from county leadership.

Johnston also played a central role in the county's purchase and consolidation of departments into a new facility designed to streamline services for citizens. As the county continues the transition, Johnston remains committed to ensuring revenue from the sale of the vacated buildings is maximized.

His focus on financial responsibility is a reflection of his successful background in business and agriculture. As a lifelong farmer, Johnston learned early on that survival depends on careful planning, budgeting, and adapting to change through diversification. Those lessons, he says, translate directly to

businesses taught me how to weigh risks and make decisions that provide for long-term sustainability," Johnston says. "These are necessary skills when you're a Commissioner in charge of a multimillion dollar county budget."

Colleagues describe him as extremely hard-working and solution-oriented someone who looks for common ground rather than conflict. Whether discussing infrastructure upgrades, public safety, or supporting local businesses and farmers, he works to balance the diverse needs of the county's communities. Johnston says he frames every decision around a simple question: What serves the people of Yamhill County best?

Looking ahead, Johnston says his priorities include continuing the work he's been doing since day one including:

- "Farming and managing my own Maintaining a balanced budget and increasing county reserves,
 - Supporting initiatives to make local parks financially self-sustaining and accessible to the public, Funding the Sheriff's Office and
 - maintaining a strong commitment to
 - Advocating for an addiction treatment center within the county to better serve residents,
 - And maintaining the current tax rate with <u>no new taxes</u>.

Through a combination of practical leadership, fiscal stewardship, and lessons learned from his own life experiences, Commissioner Kit Johnston has built a record of service grounded in responsibility, collaboration, and a genuine commitment to the people of Yamhill





KEEPING IT LOCAL, KEEPING IT USEFUL

How MacHub turns donations into community strength

At MacHub, one simple idea drives everything: when items get a second life, people get a better one.

With consumption trends rising globally and resulting in overflowing donation centers, many pre-owned goods are destined to landfills. Its hope is to utilize powerful software solutions to efficiently convert donated goods into sales giving pre-owned items another chance at life and in turn having the proceeds go right back into local communities through their nonprofit partnerships.

Since 2014, the McMinnville nonprofit has served as a community warehouse for material donations, ensuring household goods reach those who need them most instead of ending up in a landfill.

As the service branch of Swedemom Center of Giving, MacHub collects, sorts, and redistributes donated items to local nonprofits and families, stretching resources further and building sustainable solutions. In 2024 alone, the team diverted 18,000 pounds of goods, saving

partner agencies nearly \$17,550 — funds they could invest back into vital programs.

MacHub supports students in school, individuals struggling with homelessness or lack of resources, elderly folks in care facilities, single parents, and more — even passing along items to animal shelters.

Recently, the nonprofit launched its Everyone Deserves A Bed campaign. MacHub accepts donations of pre-owned mattresses and bed frames in good condition, but this donation stream isn't enough to fulfill the need in our community. As it works toward its \$10,000 goal, MacHub will work with local mattress companies to purchases beds to pass through to our nonprofit partners.

GRAND RONDE TRIBE LOOKS BEYOND ITS PAST TO SECURE ITS FUTURE



Serving members, celebrating sovereignty and preserving traditions

The story of the Confederated Tribes of Grand Ronde is one of persistence and perseverance. A western Oregon Treaty Tribe, Grand Ronde includes more than 30 tribes and bands that resided throughout western Oregon, southwestern Washington and northern California. They lived off the land where fish and game were plentiful.

Tribal members were removed from these homelands and relocated to the Grand Ronde valley after signing treaties with the United States Government in 1855. The original 60,000-acre Grand Ronde Reservation was formally established in 1857, but federal policies chipped away these lands. Tribal lands were eventually reduced to a single cemetery by the time Grand Ronde was termi-

Grand Ronde community members refused to accept termination as its fate. After years of hard work and dedication,

the Grand Ronde Tribe was restored in 1983 and took possession of its 10,000acre reservation in 1988. The opening of Spirit Mountain Casino in 1995 provided financial stability to the Tribe while being one of the largest employers in Polk and Yamhill counties. Its success has allowed the Tribe to rebuild its land base and provide opportunities and services to the community and its

The Grand Ronde Tribe is a community known as a caring people dedicated to the principles of honesty and integrity. Since restoration, Grand Ronde has continued to rebuild its nation, strengthen its culture, and develop programs to meet the needs of its members. Grand Ronde strives to preserve tribal sovereignty, its tribal culture and its cultural traditions for future generations.

"Meeting people who trusted me with their family heirlooms made me



Williams, who joined the cancer foundation in 2020, works with administrative assistant Lisa Boschee, who does the day-to-day work helping patients/clients


with bills and other needs.


Mrs. Weber, the work is personal — after experiencing the benefits of these tools herself, she wanted to create a place where others could access the same support.



PRIMISYS COMPUTERS GROWS FROM DOWNTOWN SHOP TO REGIONAL TECH PARTNER

Offering network, phone, security and audio/video services to wide range of clients

Primisys Computers started as a small downtown repair counter. Today, the McMinnville company runs a busy retail workshop while also supporting hundreds of businesses in Yamhill County and beyond as a managed service provider.

On any weekday, customers bring in laptops for tune-ups or ask for a custombuilt PC. In the back rooms and out in the field, Primisys technicians are wiring new buildings, fixing office networks, and keeping phone systems and cameras running for restaurants, factories, farms, nonprofits, and professional offices.

Everyday networks, built to stay online: Primisys designs and looks after the basic plumbing of modern workplaces: the cables in the walls, the internet connections, and the equipment that ties it all together. The company sets up reliable Wi-Fi for offices, schools, shops, and large outdoor spaces — everything from guest internet in dining rooms to longrange wireless links that connect barns and outbuildings. It also separates sensitive systems (like registers or production machines) from guest traffic, a step that helps keep businesses secure and running.

Internet phone systems with local support:

Many clients have moved their phones to internet-based systems. Primisys installs and manages those, too — desk phones, mobile apps, and computer headsets on one company number. Common features include menu greetings, ring groups for busy front desks, voicemail sent to email, and paging tied

into shop or warehouse speakers. The company also sets up 911 location details and call-quality settings so conversations stay clear.

Cameras, sound, and meeting rooms: Beyond computers, Primisys installs security cameras and commercial sound systems. That can mean paging in a factory, background music in a café, or a conference room that works without fuss. The aim is for the screens, speakers, and cameras to share the same backbone so there's less gear to babysit.

Public-sector support and compliance: Primisys also works with city and other public agencies. The company helps meet government IT requirements — such as access controls, data retention, device encryption, multi-factor sign-in, and audit-ready documentation — while keeping day-to-day systems usable for staff. Services include assistance with policy updates, user training, and proof-of-compliance materials that departments often need for annual reviews and grant reporting.

Custom software built here:

Primisys employs a team of software developers. Their work is well known in agriculture: local processors say the company's hazelnut software handles day-to-day operations from receiving to payments, and that practically the entire Oregon hazelnut industry relies on it. Another major line is software for commodity trading companies, which use Primisys tools to handle contracts, inventory, logistics paperwork, billing, and reporting. Both platforms are supported

with regular updates and help from the same team that built them.

Who they serve:

The client list ranges widely.

Restaurants and hospitality — dependable point-of-sale networks, guest Wi-Fi, paging, phones, and cameras.

Industrial fabrication and manufacturing — sturdy shop-floor networks, plantwide paging, secure remote access for vendors, and round-the-clock monitoring.

Agriculture and food processing — long-distance Wi-Fi between buildings, bin and barn connectivity, sensors and cameras, and easy communication among crews.

Professional services and nonprofits — hosted business apps, backups, security tools, and flexible phone options for hybrid work.

Government offices — secure networks, compliance support, recordsfriendly email and backup, and clear documentation for audits.

A service counter that never left:

Despite its growth, Primisys still runs a walk-in service desk. The staff builds new systems for gaming, design, and office work, and repairs slow or broken machines with quick turnaround.

With many large windows that provide light on even the rainiest day, a spacious courtyard accessible from two gathering areas in the community, and sight lines designed to have a high level of visibility for safety, Marjorie House invites you in and says "Welcome Home."

Family owned and managed, there is every effort made to give families and residents a sense of not being divided from the decision makers, but rather being a part of a team with everyone having input into the well-being of the residents.

Activities are at the center of days at Marjorie House. Like every human being, those with a dementia have a need for a purpose-driven life. Our competent,

creative Life Enrichment staff tries daily to make sure that happens. At Marjorie House, we believe each individual has potential of one sort or another until life is over. Our job is to tap that potential, serve it, and continually reassess it. That served potential can give purpose. Since the doors opened, Marjorie House has offered a Life Enrichment program for all its residents. That means staff are there seven days a week, more than eight hours a day, to "engage people in a productive way." The community Life Enrichment staff develops monthly activity plans filled with five to seven group options residents can enjoy each day. While most activities are done in groups, one-on-one engagement between a resident and a staff member can be equally enriching, and is sometimes the most appropriate way to create a resident's sense of peace and purpose.

The nature of dementia is for the body and brain activity to decrease, often making people reclusive. But keeping

the mind and body active and engaged has plenty of positive benefits, such as helping to spark memories and increase people's physical ability. And elevated physical ability can lessen the risks, for instance, of a life-ending or debilitating fall, which is a critical concern in long-

Keeping residents engaged also makes them happier. Negative behavior and depression in individuals with dementia often happen as the result of boredom, but residents who are busy and have something purposeful to do are less likely to show negative behaviors.

Administrator Jessica Graham welcomes your calls and is happy to give you a tour through Marjorie House. Let the Marjorie House staff show you that there is a way for individuals with a diagnosis of dementia to live life in safety and dignity, while receiving 24-hour loving care. 



A Social Security Disability Claim

You Can Get Local Help With

Dealing with the Social Security Administration for a Disability claim can be very frustrating and complicated, especially if you are denied and have to appeal all the way to a Hearing. Luckily McMinnville has a local attorney who can help.

If you have taken early retirement benefits because you can no longer work, you might be able to file for Disability and no longer have an early retirement penalty. However, the Social Security system is complex and winning a claim can be hard. It's not just telling a judge you can't do things anymore. Opinions must be obtained from doctors, records properly obtained, vocational analysis performed, along with other complex tasks.

Attorney Cuppett is different from many other Social Security law firms you might see advertised in that he only has one office, located in McMinnville. When you call, you will only talk to him, not paralegals, secretaries or answering services. He gives personalized and thorough attention through every step of your claim. 





CASAS: ADVOCATING FOR THE CHILDREN

CASA is only program of its kind in Yamhill County

When a child or youth is placed under wardship of the court due to abuse or neglect, that child's journey to safety and stability has just begun. As you can well imagine, this can be a traumatic and confusing journey through courts and foster care. Yamhill County Court Appointed Special Advocates, CASA's, can help make that journey a little less confusing and possibly even a bit

These trained volunteers are appointed by the court when a child is placed under wardship. Their role is to advocate for the child. Children with a CASA have better outcomes. On average, they spend less time in foster care, have better educational success and are less likely to re-enter the system.


The CASA position is unique. CASAs are legal parties to the case and the CASA is the only party directly charged with "looking out for the best interests of the child." That may seem odd as everyone on the case wants the best outcome; but attorneys, even for the child, must do as


directed by their client which may not always be an action that best benefits the youth. CASAs also have the luxury of having only a single case so their focus is ONLY the best interests of the child. This focus contributes to better outcomes in the form of more trauma, medical or mental health service recommendations and the follow through to see that each service happens. The CASA works with caseworkers, the child's parents, teachers, doctors and therapists to hear all perspectives and craft an unbiased but complete picture of the child's needs for the court. The CASA is also charged with making certain the youth's voice is heard, even for wishes that may run counter to the youth's best interests.

TRADITIONAL METHODS PRODUCE **OUTSTANDING SPARKLING WINES**

Established in 2022 by Jim and Jan Bernau, Domaine Willamette was founded with a singular purpose: to craft world-class méthode traditionnelle sparkling wines. At the center of this mission is an underground aging cellar, carved into the hillside of Oregon's Dundee Hills AVA, where wines mature slowly on the lees to build character, depth and refinement.

The estate is set within the Bernau Estate Vineyard, a 20-acre site farmed to rigorous biodynamic standards and certified by Demeter. Originally planted with Pinot Noir in 1994, the vineyard was expanded in 2019 to include Pinot Meunier and Chardonnay, the classic varietals of Champagne. Together, these grapes provide the backbone for the sparkling wines that define Domaine Willamette.

Guests to the winery are greeted with an experience that blends wine, food and place. Tastings feature méthode traditionnelle sparkling wines alongside Pinot Noirs from the Dundee Hills AVA and bold red wines sourced from the Oregon side of the Walla Walla Valley. Culinary pairings highlight local ingredients, and guided tours introduce visitors to the estate's biodynamic gardens and vineyards. The property has also become

a sought-after venue for private gatherings and holiday celebrations, offering a setting that pairs modern hospitality with the guiet beauty of Oregon wine country.

The sparkling wines are produced in the traditions of France's Champagne region, using time-honored methods adapted for Oregon. After secondary fermentation in the bottle, the wines are aged a minimum of 18 months in the underground cellar. During this time, the lees impart texture and complexity before disgorgement, a precise process that ensures clarity and consistency while preserving delicate bubbles and aromas. The result is a portfolio of sparkling wines that balance elegance with a distinctly Oregon expression of fruit and terroir.

Domaine Willamette's winery and tasting room were designed with both artistry and sustainability in mind. In 2023, the property was recognized with the Portland Business Journal's Landmark Award, which honored its innovative use of sustainable materials such as a mass timber roof and solar shingles, as well as art installations by regional artists. Water features, open spaces and natural design elements evoke the landscape of the Willamette Valley, creating a destination that celebrates both wine and place.


The estate is part of the Dundee Hills Winegrowers Association and the Willamette Valley Wineries Association, underscoring its commitment to regional collaboration and quality standards. Its recognition within the broader Oregon wine community reflects a balance of innovation and tradition — a hallmark of the state's wine industry.

The vision for Domaine Willamette traces back to Jim Bernau, who founded Willamette Valley Vineyards in 1983 with the dream of producing world-class Pinot Noir in Oregon. Domaine Willamette represents both a continuation and an evolution of that vision. Built in partnership with Jan Bernau, the project was guided by a belief that Oregon's soils and climate could produce world-caliber sparkling wines.

From its Demeter-certified vineyard to its underground cellar, Domaine Willamette was designed with singular focus. It is more than a tasting room or winery; it is a place where visitors can encounter the full breadth of Oregon's wine story. Each glass reflects the union of land, tradition and craft, and each visit offers an opportunity to connect with the roots of a region that has earned a place on the global wine stage.







Pride and responsibility go hand-in-hand with a multi-generational family business

Oregon Lithoprint and the News-Register, two pillars of McMinnville's business community, have roots that go nearly as deep as the history of Yamhill County itself.

Two Lafayette newspapers (one of

which moved within a few years to McMinnville) that started in 1881 and 1886 merged to form the Telephone-Register, and in 1928, Lars Bladine of Iowa bought it. His eldest son, Jack, moved to McMinnville to begin family operation of the newspaper. His younger brother, Philip, soon joined, and together they eventually purchased the News-Reporter (whose lineage dated back to 1866 with the Lafayette Courier) to create the News-Register. For more than 90 years, the News-Register has been a Bladine familyowned newspaper, currently operated by Lars' descendants who live in and are dedicated to the community. The paper is now edited by Philip Ossie Bladine, the fourth-generation to preside over the paper, while his father, Jeb, continues as publisher/president.

"There's definitely a unique sense of pride and responsibility that comes with being part of a multi-generational family business," Ossie said.

Oregon Lithoprint was created in 1963 as a sister corporation to the News-Register Publishing Co., and the two companies merged in 1983, with OLI surviving as corporate name and printing operation, and News-Register Publishing Co. helming the newspaper operation.

OLI, located in McMinnville's industrial park, is a regional provider of commercial offset printing and related services, specializing in the printing, binding and distribution of newspapers, magazines, bound books and other printed products.

The company gained statewide stature for producing Oregon Voters' Pamphlet projects from 1988 through 2000. Operating out of a 35,000-square-foot facility built in 1996, OLI is recognized around Oregon and the Pacific Northwest for its consistently high quality web and digital printing services.

"There's only a handful of operations in the state with our capabilities, and few, if any, that produce as high quality of work," Ossie said.

The News-Register continues to forge ahead with an award-winning staff that rivals the size and expertise of many daily papers in the region. Supported by advertisers and subscribers who understand the importance of local, independent and professionally reported journalism, the News-Register is a key player in the community — writing history's first draft, and providing a forum for local readers to discuss and debate current issues.

"The importance of local journalism has never been greater," Ossie said. "Our goal every day is to foster better understanding of local issues and encourage residents to engage in each process that effects their daily lives."

In 2023, the News-Register staff moved

from its downtown headquarters to the OLI building, so that the two sides of the company can now operate more cohesively.

The newspaper isn't the only locallyproduced publication that rolls off OLI's presses. Oregon Wine Press, an essential monthly on the latest wine industry news, is also produced and printed here, along with the popular annual Best of Mac, Yamhill Valley Visitor Guide, Roots to Roofs, and the publication you're holding in your hands. Collectively, these and other local publications provide an unparalleled and reliable source of the region's business and lifestyle trends.

"Our readers are more connected to their community and more knowledgeable about the local news, events and decisions made that immediately affect their day-to-day lives," Ossie said.
