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
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UPGRADE YOUR HOME IN 2021

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
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4 BACKYARD SHADE IDEAS

GARDEN

If your property doesn't provide you with enough shade, here are four stylish structures that can give you a break from the sun.



AWNING

This type of device can be rolled out over a patio or deck when you need shade and is easily retracted when not in use. However, it needs to be secured to an exterior wall first. Although typically controlled by a hand crank, some newer models open and close with the press of a button.

FREESTANDING GAZEBO

This sturdy structure consists of a

metal frame with four pillars and a canvas roof. Some models include curtains that can be closed for privacy or to block the sun.

ARBOR

This classic garden feature is often used to create an entryway. However, since its arches are typically lined with vines and other climbing plants, it can also offer respite from the sun.

FOLDING CANOPY

This temporary structure can be unfolded and set up within minutes. It's a practical solution for backyard parties and picnics when you need to accommodate a number of guests.

All of these structures can provide you with ample shade and a comfortable place to lounge in your backyard. This summer, minimize the risk of getting sunburned by installing one or more of these devices.

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6 PRIVACY OPTIONS FOR YOUR YARD

If you want your yard to be a private oasis where you can relax unobserved, you'll need to install a privacy screen. Here are six options to consider.

LOUVRES The angle of the slats on most louvred privacy screens can be adjusted to allow plenty of natural light in while still shielding your yard from view. They're usually made of wood or steel.

TRELLISES Available in many different styles and sizes, trellises look great on their own or as a support for climbing plants. If you want a privacy screen that does double duty, grow fruitbearing vines along it like cucumber or grape.


CURTAINS One easy way to create privacy is to hang large swaths of fabric from a pergola or similar structure. Best of all, they can simply be moved aside when they're not needed.

HEDGES A sturdy hedge creates a natural screen, barrier and home for local wildlife. Cedar is a good choice, but there are many other types of shrubs that make nice hedges.

FENCES Metal and wood fences are a pricier option, but they last a long time and add value to your property. For a modern look, combine materials.

SHADES Typically made of canvas, outdoor shades are great for spaces that don't require constant privacy. Simply pull the shades down when you want them and retract them when you don't.

In addition to shielding you from view, privacy features add visual interest to your yard and make it a more beautiful place to spend your time.



TIPS FOR INSTALLING WATER FEATURES

If you want to install a fountain or similar type of water feature in your yard, there are three factors to consider: style, location and upkeep. Here's what you should know.



STYLE

Some fountains are freestanding, which means they can be placed in the middle of your yard. Others are wall-mounted and typically incorporated into another water feature.

You should also think about the fountain's size and shape as well as the durability of its material. Don't forget to consider the amount of noise the fountain will make.

LOCATION

The right spot to install your fountain is one that's near a watertight electrical outlet. The location should also be protected from the wind and moderately shaded.

UPKEEP


Fountains and other water features need to be maintained. You should check the water level periodically and replenish it as required. You'll also need to remove debris from the pump and clean the filter on a regular basis. Additionally, you may need to use special products to help control moss, algae and plant growth.

At the end of the summer you'll also need to empty the fountain, clean and store the equipment and cover the outdoor structure with canvas.

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SELECTING AN OUTDOOR FIREPLACE

Do you want a fireplace for your backyard? With so many outdoor models available, you should take the time to find one that suits your needs. Here are a couple of things to think about.



THE FUEL

One of the first decisions you'll need to make is whether you want a fireplace that uses wood or gas. While wood-burning fireplaces are easy to install and give off a pleasant aroma, they require regular maintenance. You'll also need somewhere to store the logs, and some municipalities have restrictions on the use of wood firepits.

Contrarily, fireplaces that run on natural gas or propane are easy to maintain. Another advantage is that you can adjust the intensity of the flames with the push of a button. However, you must be able to connect it to a gas line or willing to periodically refill the tank.

THE USE

Consider how you want to use your outdoor fireplace. If you want to make it a gathering place for friends and family, opt for a round model. To create a relaxing corner where you can curl up in privacy, a rectangular fireplace may be more suitable. If you plan to cook over the embers, choose a model with a grill.

Finally, keep in mind your budget and space limitations when shopping for an outdoor fireplace. Consult the staff at your local hardware store for additional advice.

3 FRUIT SHRUBS FOR YOUR GARDEN

There are several advantages to growing fruit shrubs. In addition to improving the look of your yard, many of these plants produce edible berries. Here are three species to consider.







1. BLACK CHOKEBERRY

This easy-to-grow ornamental shrub will brighten up your yard in spring with its white and pink blooms. After admiring the flowers, you can harvest handfuls of the black berries, which are rich in antioxidants and can be used to make jam, juice and wine.

2. ELDERBERRY

This plant produces large, flat clusters of tiny white flowers that have edible

petals. As for the berries, they must be cooked prior to eating them. Failing to do so is likely to result in an upset stomach. However, their tart taste makes them a great option for pie fillings, jams and syrups.

3. HIGHBUSH CRANBERRY

Though it's different from a regular cranberry, this bright red fruit does have a similar taste. The berries are naturally high in pectin, which makes them ideal for making jams and jellies. Keep in mind, however, that this shrub can grow up to thirteen feet tall.

Before you select a fruit shrub for your yard, make sure it's well-suited for the climate in your area. Consult the hardiness zone on the plant's label or speak with a specialist at your local Yamhill County garden center.

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HOW TO ATTRACT BIRDS TO YOUR GARDEN

Being able to watch and admire the birds in your backyard is one of the great pleasures of gardening. Here are some tips to help you draw more birds to your landscape.





GETTING STARTED

If you want to attract more birds to your garden, keep in mind that they have more or less the same physical needs as human beings: water, food, and shelter. That means the main elements in any garden should include a birdbath or fountain to provide water, trees and birdhouses for shelter, and edible plants as a source of food.

You can encourage birds to live in your garden by growing their favorite plants. Hummingbirds, for example, are attracted to brightly colored flowers. Other birds are attracted by plants such as sunflowers, asters, African marigolds, and other flowers that produce large quantities of seeds.

Birds love water, but they don't necessarily like to drink it from the ground, where they are vulnerable to predators, such as cats. Position your birdbath close to some trees or a hedge, where the birds can seek temporary refuge. Also ensure that any source of water is cleaned

regularly, as birds won't frequent places of doubtful cleanliness.

It goes without saying that you should never use pesticides in your garden — they are extremely harmful to birds. Whether natural or chemical, these products often disrupt the delicate balance of nature. Pesticides also kill a lot of insects, which are an important food source for many birds.

ADD LIFE TO YOUR GARDEN WITH BIRDHOUSES

Are you a fan of gardening and birdwatching? Then why not combine your two hobbies by incorporating birdhouses into your landscaping? Here are a few tips for creating a garden filled with colorful blooms and the chirps of winged creatures all summer long.

SPECIES TO CHARM

First off, determine which types of bird you'd like to attract. To avoid disappointment, find out which birds typically frequent your area. Next, go get some quality birdhouses from your local gardening center or hardware store. Ask a salesperson to help you choose the best models for the types of bird you're looking to attract. You'll need to consider the size of the entrance and the available nesting space inside of the birdhouse.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR

Choose birdhouses with the following features:

- Mold-resistant materials (cedar wood is an excellent choice)
- A design that allows optimal ventilation and drainage
- A roof that juts out a few centimeters over the entrance
- A door that allows easy access to the inside for cleaning
- A look that's harmonious with the rest of your landscaping

ATTRACTING HUMMINGBIRDS

Who isn't thrilled to see a hummingbird in the backyard, that tiny wonder of nature, frenetically swooping from one plant to the next. The best way to attract one to your home is to have a water feature in your yard, along with trees and vines or flowers at least two feet high.

Hummingbirds can travel up to six hundred miles, as they follow the flowering season of their favorite plants. Their beaks are designed to suck nectar: they insert their long, needle-like beaks into flowers and drink quickly with their tongues. These tiny birds are particularly attracted to flute-shaped red flowers, such as fuchsia, honeysuckle, morning glory, and sage — all plant varieties that are easily found in garden centers.

It is also possible to attract hummingbirds by installing feeders filled with artificial nectar. These are sold in most garden centers and department stores.

a feeding hummingbird, install a feeder on a windowsill, which will allow you to admire it from inside your home. It is also a good idea to install a feeder near a source of water, as these birds need to drink eight times their weight in water every day. Having trees and shrubs in which they can build their nests is another great way to keep them close to your home all summer long. You'll soon agree that the pleasures of gardening go beyond fresh flowers and vegetables!



Research online to get an idea of what's out there, but don't


let what you see on the web determine if a home's right for you or not. Always visit in person if the house meets your needs and the price and neighborhood are the right fit.

The most important thing when it comes to buying a home is to find a place that meets your needs and budget. Avoid being swayed by emotion and instead rely on reason and research to make the right decision.

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

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GREENIDEAS

Making your home more energy efficient is good for the planet and your wallet. Here are a few tips to help you reduce your energy consumption during the summer months.

Upgrade your air conditioner. You can lower your energy bills considerably by switching to an Energy Star certified model, especially if your current unit is more than 10 years old. For best results, use HEPA filters.

Allow fresh air to circulate.

A ceiling fan can help cool a room and reduce strain on your air conditioner. Choose an Energy Star certified model to minimize energy consumption.

Keep the heat out. Close blinds and curtains during the day, especially those on southern-facing windows. This will help regulate your indoor temperature.
