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What outdoor work can you do to prepare for winter?

Empty, clean and store your rain barrels and garden hoses. Put your garden furniture, outdoor games and barbecue in your shed, garage or attic. However, make sure to leave the propane tank outside.

Inspect

Take a walk around your property to make sure everything is in order.

1. Check the doors and windows for leaks

Windows and doors can account for up to a quarter of your home's heat loss. If your windows are drafty, try installing weatherstripping to reduce your heating bill before you consider replacing them.

2. Remove the window screens

Leaving the bug screens on your windows encourages and traps condensation. Now is the time to clean and remove them for winter. This'll also allow more light and solar heat to enter your home.

3. Maintain your heating and ventilation systems

Clean your electric baseboard heaters to avoid an unpleasant burning when you turn them on. Wash or replace the filters on your air exchanger, keep furniture and curtains away from heat sources and inspect your appliances. Wipe down the grille of your bathroom exhaust fan with a damp cloth.

4. Check the condition of all detectors

Dust your smoke and carbon monoxide detectors and replace the batteries if

necessary. Moreover, verify that they haven't expired and test them to ensure they're working properly.

5. Clean your wood stove and chimney

Wash and inspect your wood stove or fireplace before using it for the first time. Contact a professional to sweep your chimney to ensure it's clear. Avoid using sweeping logs, as they're not as effective.

2. Polypropylene fiber

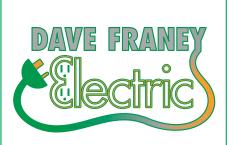

This material, made of coconut fiber, typically comes in a natural ecru color. It can give your exterior a unique look and works best on wood and concrete surfaces. The downside? Coir tends to retain water and dust. In addition, if not installed well, it may become loose over time.

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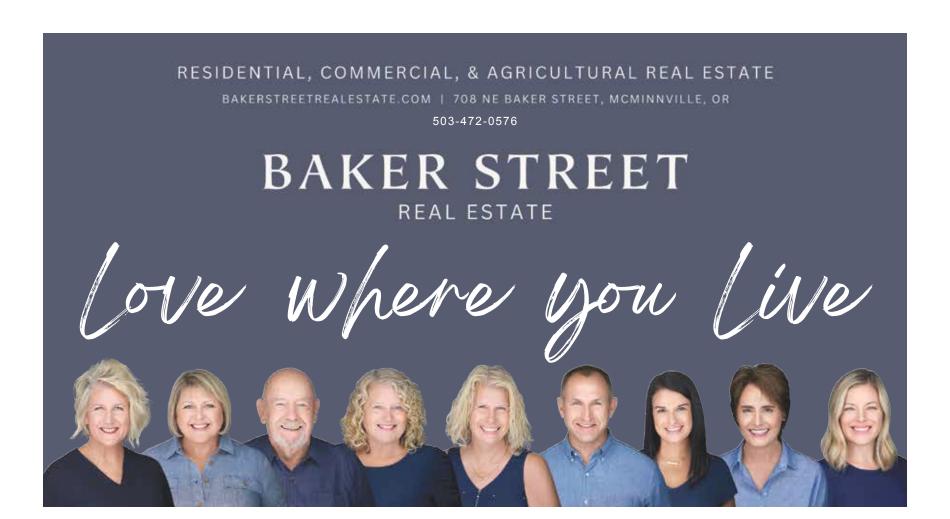

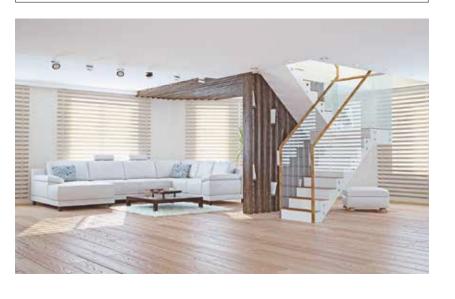

Italian wedding soup

This tasty, hearty soup is an Italian classic. Serve it on a cold day for maximum comfort!



Servings: 6

INGREDIENTS

- 7 ounces ground beef • 7 ounces ground pork
- 1/2 cup Italian breadcrumbs
- 3 garlic cloves, finely chopped, divided
- 1/2 cup Parmesan cheese, grated, divided
- 1/2 cup fresh Italian parsley, finely chopped, divided
- 2 tablespoons butter
- 1 1/2 cups carrots, finely diced
- 1 cup onion, finely diced
- 1 cup celery, finely diced • 8 cups chicken stock
- 1 teaspoon dried oregano
- 1 teaspoon dried rosemary • 1 teaspoon dried parsley
- 1/2 teaspoon dried thyme
- 1/2 teaspoon red pepper flakes • 1/2 teaspoon garlic powder
- 3/4 cup uncooked orzo (or puntalette)
- 7 ounces fresh spinach • Salt and pepper, to taste



- 1. In a large bowl, combine the beef, pork, breadcrumbs, egg, 2 cloves of garlic, half the Parmesan cheese and half the parsley. Season with salt and pepper. Using your hands, shape them into small balls about 1 inch in dia-
- 2. In a large pot, melt the butter and brown the meatballs on all sides, a few at a time. Set aside.
- 3. In the same pot, sauté the carrots, onions and celery for a few minutes. Season with salt and pepper. Add the remaining garlic and continue cooking for about 1 minute. Add the chicken stock and all the dried spices. Bring to a boil, then reduce the heat to a gentle simmer.
- 4. Add the meatballs and pasta and simmer for about 10 minutes until the meatballs are fully cooked. Adjust seasoning if necessary. Add the spinach right before serving.
- 5. Pour the soup into 6 pretty serving bowls. Garnish with the remaining fresh parsley and Parmesan cheese.



Smørrebrød

This divine open-faced Danish sandwich features a variety of gourmet toppings, making it perfect for breakfast or brunch.



Servings: 2

INGREDIENTS

- 1/2 a ripe avocado
- 1 egg 2 slices rye bread
- 1 tablespoon butter, softened • 3 sprigs fresh dill
- 1 shallot, sliced
- 2 tablespoons capers • 3.5 ounces smoked salmon, sliced
- 1/4 cup fresh watercress • Salt and pepper, to taste



DIRECTIONS

- 1. In a small bowl, mash the avocado with a fork. Season with salt and pepper and set aside.
- 2. Fill a small pot with water and bring it to a boil. Reduce the heat, gently place the egg into the water, and simmer for 6 to 7 minutes, depending on its size. Remove the egg from the pot and immediately immerse it in cold water to stop cooking.
- 3. Toast and butter the slices of rye bread.
- 4. Divide the avocado mixture between the 2 slices of bread. Place a few dill fronds on each slice. Divide the shallot, capers, smoked salmon and watercress evenly between the slices.
- 5. Peel the egg and cut it in half. Place each half on the smørrebrød. Garnish with the remaining dill and season with salt and pepper.



Swiss cheese fondue

Want to enjoy an interactive meal in good company? This cheese fondue from Switzerland is a pure delight.



Servings: 6

INGREDIENTS

- 1 clove garlic, crushed
- 2 teaspoons cornstarch • 1 cup dry white wine
- 14 ounces Gruyere cheese, grated
- 7 ounces Vacherin cheese, grated
- 7 ounces Emmental cheese, grated

SWITZERLAND

- 1/2 teaspoon freshly ground nutmeg • Freshly ground black pepper, to taste
- 2 tablespoons kirsch
- 1 baguette, cut into cubes

DIRECTIONS

- 1. Rub the inside of the fondue pot with the crushed garlic clove. Add the cornstarch and wine to the fondue pot and whisk to combine.
- 2. Turn the fondue pot up to medium-high. Once the wine is hot, gradually add the cheeses, stirring to melt them. Season with nutmeg and pepper to taste. Finish with the kirsch.
- Serve with cubed bread. Guests can dip the bread into the sauce with a fondue fork.

In addition to cubed bread, feel free to serve other foods for dipping, such as cold cuts, sausages and vegetables. Let your imagination run wild!

Servings: 24

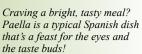
INGREDIENTS • 2 1/4 cups brown sugar

- 2 egg yolks
- 1 cup unsalted butter, room temperature
- 3 tablespoons 35% heavy whipping cream
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1 teaspoon lemon zest
- 1 cup almond flour • 3 1/4 cups all-purpose flour
- 2 teaspoons ground cinnamon
- 1/2 teaspoon baking soda • 1/2 teaspoon ground nutmeg
- 1/2 teaspoon ground cloves • 1/2 teaspoon ground ginger
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon baking powder • 1/4 teaspoon ground cardamom
- 1/4 teaspoon ground aniseed

DIRECTIONS

- 1. In a large bowl, combine the brown sugar, butter, egg yolks, cream, vanilla and lemon zest. Mix for about 5 minutes using an electric mixer until pale and airy. Add the almond flour and mix until well incorporated.
- 2. In a separate bowl, combine the remaining ingredients. Gently pour the dry ingredients into the wet ingredients, beating constantly. Form a ball with your hands, cover it with plastic wrap and let it stand at room temperature overnight.
- 3. Preheat the oven to 375 F. Using a rolling pin, roll out the dough to about 1/2 inch thick. Cut out pretty shapes with a cookie cutter or knife.
- 4. Place the cookies on a parchment-lined baking sheet. Bake for 12 minutes or until lightly browned. Let cool completely before serving.

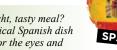

- **4. Put up a large mirror.** Hang a large mirror on the wall across from the window to let more light into the room. This will give the illusion of a bigger window.
- **5. Place low furniture around the window.** When decorating your space, place small or low-profile furniture pieces near the window, so the eye is tricked by the scale.

If the ice is thick and poses a slip-and-fall hazard, apply a food-based de-icing product that's colored to help you avoid



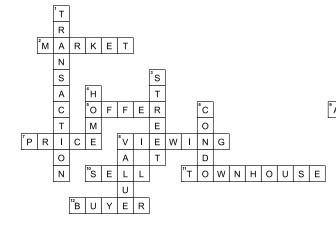
spreading too much. Grape pulp and beetroot, which have been used successfully on some highways in North America, are promising solutions.

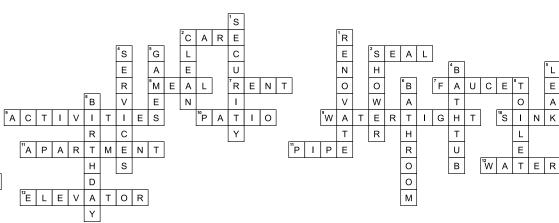
You can also find eco-friendly de-icers that don't contain harmful magnesium chloride or calcium chloride at your
