

As a stacker operator at Hampton Lumber's Willamina Division, Kelly Weir runs a machine that stacks rough-cut lumber for transport to the mill's planer.

She's responsible for making sure the boards are placed correctly to ensure no crossups that could create broken boards or unstable loads.

Weir, who's been with Hampton for a year, loves her job with the mill and her coworkers, as well. But she didn't set out to work in the lumber industry; instead, after growing up in North Bend, she trained to be a certified esthetician.

She learned about Hampton Lumber after moving to the Willamina area. It fit her desire to work for a family-owned company that contributed to the community and cared about its employees.

As a stacker operator, she especially enjoys working both inside and outside. "I can see what the weather is doing all the time!" she said.


The best part of her job, she said, is "the company I work for, my customers, and the people I get to work with every day."
